

- (a) Black represents the people of Kenya.
- (b) Red represents the struggle for Freedom.
- (c) Green represents Kenya's agriculture and natural resources.
- (d) White represents unity and peace.
- (e) The Black and Gold Shield symbolises the defence of Freedom.

6. The Cabinet is invited,

- (1) To decide the size and design of the shield;
- (2) To decide which colour of gold should be adopted;
- (3) To adopt white strips separating the major colours, rather than gold;
- (4) To submit the design to Her Majesty for formal approval, through the Admiralty and the College of Arms, as is customary;
- (5) To agree not to make the details of the Flag public until Her Majesty's approval has been received;
- (6) To authorise arrangements to be made immediately for the production of the Flag;
- (7) To decide an official description of the Flag.
